Lasallian Reflection from Brother Jason:

Dear Lasallians,

This is being written from the historic city of Melaka. As I compose this, and as the evening sun sets behind thick dull clouds in the distance, the view from my room is of St Francis' Institution's very green football field! As I take in all this, the Brothers from the *Lasallian East Asia District* or LEAD (click here for more information) are beginning to arrive for LEAD's 3rd District Assembly.

LEAD comprises about 133 Brothers from seven countries: Malaysia, Singapore, Hong Kong, Myanmar, Thailand, Japan and the Philippines. The District Assembly is convened every four years to discuss matters and forward-plan details pertaining to the Brothers: Governance, Interior Life, Community Life, Mission, Association, Vocation, Formation and Stewardship of Resources. We are also involved in the process to elect a new Brother Visitor.

As we enter the 3rd week of Advent, we celebrate the profound theme of *joy*. For me personally, it is indeed a *joy* to be renewing fraternal friendships with the Brothers, some of whom were instrumental in my life when I was a young Brother. And as we plot and plan the future of the Lasallian presence in LEAD, some of us will be checking for the *joy factor*. By that, I mean asking if our Mission and Presence in LEAD brings us *real*, *fulfilling joy*. And if so, perhaps that is a good indicator of what we are being called to do at this point in time.

In our heart of hearts, teachers know that the real effect of teaching results in joy. And this joy was echoed this morning when one Brother summarized what being involved in education was all about: to go MAD - 'make a difference' in the life of one, one at a time!

Acknowledging the joyful vocation of teaching, St John Baptist de La Salle often challenged the Brothers to check their joy factor too. In fact, more relevant today than ever before, he challenges us daily to find the source of this joy: Does your joy come from within? (Meditations for Sundays and Principal Feasts).

For the assembled Brothers in Melaka, the next few days will be about hard, but joyful work. Like De La Salle, we echo one of


his favourite prayers from the Prophet Habakkuk: "Lord, the work is Yours!"

Any unclaimed items from the Lost & Found box will be recycled on the 20th December.




Chinese IB Excursion to Purple Cane


Student Representative Council
