## Lasallian Reflection from Brother Jason:

Dear Lasallians,

It is often said – half jokingly, I'm sure – that we are getting quite good at 'talking the talk' instead of 'walking the talk!'

My conversations with the 4 students who returned from the 28<sup>th</sup> National Lasallian Youth Convention (on Lasallian fire, no doubt!) all centred around the above; around the ever constant challenge to *'walk the talk'* instead of just *'talking the talk'*. In other words, we must have integrity to do what we say we will do as Lasallians in a Lasallian school, the 4 student post-conventioneers reminded me.

Well, *Together and By Association*, 99 Lasallians in the school community quite literally *ran the talk* at the recently concluded 12 Hour Run. Organized by Ms Kathy Smyth, and assisted by Zuriel Gan (Year 12) and her team, many thanks must be given to all who participated and also to our Security Guards for keeping the runners safe throughout the night.

This annual run is always held in aid of a Lasallian Project somewhere in the world via SECOLI (click <u>here</u> for more information) – our central organization based in Rome that contributes 100% of each dollar raised to the beneficiary.

This year a rural Lasallian boarding school in Karameno, Kenya was selected as the beneficiary of the 12 Hour Run. Brother Raoul Traore, FSC from SECOLI described the school:

The school opened its doors to students in January 2016, and this year is the third year of operations with 123 resident students. Courses are based on an innovative educational model, coupling instruction with a hands-on apprenticeship working on the school's cultivated plots and with livestock. They seek support for bedroom equipment and Kitchen & Dining room equipment.

In previous years, we raised around RM25,000. It is the hoped that we will exceed this amount for our Lasallian friends in Kenya.

## **Improving Security:**

Following a number of meetings with parents on how best to improve the security of the school site we are introducing a new initiative. After Chinese New Year all parents entering the school between the hours of 8.30am and 2.00pm will be asked to park in the outside visitors car park - NOT the basement car park. They will then be require to sign in at the main desk and then report to the respective school offices. Parents should not be on the school premises during these hours unless it is for exceptional circumstances. Should it be raining parents will be permitted to park in the lane near the pitch so that they can use the shelter. We hope that this will be welcomed and supported by parents. We all endeavour to keep our children safe at all times.

# Whole School Update

## School Uniform

We would like to ask parents for their support in the implementation of our uniform policy. The uniform guidelines are enforced within school but uniform enforcement is a collaboration between the school and parents. Parents are requested to check the uniform of their child/children. The uniform guidelines are currently being clarified to ensure the phrasing is not ambiguous. A reminder of some main areas that we have noticed:

## Hair:

- All long hair should be tied back

- Dyed hair is not allowed

- Haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. This includes the shaving of letters, logos or names into child's hair, Mohicans, steps/undercuts. Hair cannot be shorter than a number 2.

## Jewellery:

On health and safety grounds the only items of jewellery we allow children to wear in our school are small single stud earrings and watches.

## Shoes:

Canvas shoes are not allowed to be worn. Black polishable shoes must be worn. This can include PLAIN black polishable leather sports shoes without logos.

If ES children wear their PE kit to school as they have PE in the morning they may wear their trainers. However they must bring their school shoes to change into for the afternoon. An example :

## Shirts:

Parents have also asked for clarification about the school shirt. The striped shirt is designed to be worn outside the shorts. It does not need to be tucked in. In the HS the white shirt worn on Mondays does need to be tucked in.

#### **Birthdays**

We are happy that children are celebrating their birthdays with their friends at school. However, we have noticed recently that some children have been bringing in gifts, bags of sweets, etc for their whole class or year group. We would like to politely remind you that the school policy is that students may bring in one small cupcake or healthy treat, such as fruit, (one parent sent in fruit kebabs which were a huge hit with the children!) for each member of their class if they wish, not the whole year group. This is in keeping with our Lasallian values and will encourage children to show the Virtues of gratitude and moderation.

## Virtues - Flexibility

The current Virtue in the ES is **Flexibility**. Flexibility is one's openness to change and willingness to listen to the points of views held by others. As we become more flexible we are better able find creative solutions and improve ourselves.

## Trainee IB Coordinators and District Supervisors from Korea Visit SJIIM

Following a very successful two days' visit in school last week by 10 teachers from Daegu, South Korea, who were training to become IB teachers, we hosted an additional 10 teachers from the same school district on Tuesday this week. These teachers had just completed their IB training to become IBDP and IBMYP Coordinators in their public school district. They were joined by 4 supervisors who will be responsible for ensuring the successful implementation of the PYP, MYP and Diploma Programme across their district. It was a pleasure to be able to share our experience and successes with the IB programme and to give service in a way that will impact other schools and students outside of Malaysia in this way.
