#### **Lasallian Reflection from Brother Jason:**

#### Dear Lasallians,

These words are being typed at 6.08pm, Thursday evening. I am sitting in my office at the Lasallian Mission Centre while two teachers are volunteering their after-school, personal time teaching English to some of our security guards. Personally, I am touched by the *generosity* of our teachers who are *generously* spending their Valentine's evening with the guards.

Coincidentally, at the Year 7 RaVE classes this past week, we have been reflecting on the *generous* educational contributions of St Brother Miguel Cordero, FSC – patron of Miguel House – which this week's reflection is dedicated to. Unlike St Jaime Hilario (the Brother gardener-turned-martyr, you would recall), St Miguel was the learned scholar, passionate teacher and gifted linguist.

#### His story is as follows:

The future Brother Miguel was born into a family that had always been prominent in Ecuadorian politics. Crippled from birth yet a high achiever, he had to overcome family opposition to become the first Ecuadorian to join the De La Salle Brothers.

Brother Miguel was a gifted teacher from the start and a diligent student. When he was not quite twenty years old, he published the first of his many books, a Spanish grammar that soon became a standard text. In time, his research and publications in the field of literature and linguistics put him in touch with scholars all over the world and he was granted membership in the National Academies of Ecuador and Spain. Despite being a gifted academic, his students admired his simplicity, his directness, and his tender concern for them.

In 1907 he passed through New York on his way to Belgium, where he had been called to translate texts into Spanish for the use of the Brothers recently exiled from France. With his delicate health, he did not easily adjust to the rigors of the European climate. Shortly after he returned to Spain, he contracted pneumonia. He died in 1910 and was buried in Premia del Mar. His body was exhumed during the Spanish Civil War and was found to be incorrupt. In 1937 his remains were transferred to Quito where his tomb became a popular pilgrimage site. He left behind a remarkable reputation as a scholar, teacher, and saint.

Perhaps the life story of St Miguel prompts us to reflect on his many gifts and talents which he shared with others freely. What gifts and talents do we have? And how *generous* are we at sharing them with others?




#### **Improving Security**

#### Reminder to check entries and make payment

A reminder to parents and students to check their statements of entry for IGCSE carefully. You should ensure that the name on the entry is correct (I recommend that it matches your passport) and that you are entered for all of the examinations that you expect (at the appropriate tier where appropriate).

Thank you to all parents who have settled the invoice for the examinations, as we cannot register your child with the exam board until the monies are transferred. Remember that the **deadline** for any entries/changes to entries is **21 February**. Any changes after this time will incur extra costs from the exam board, CIE.

#### Service Trip

On Tuesday, 12 Feb, we launched the IGCSE Cambodia service trip. This is an exciting opportunity for our students to work alongside Camps International's local staff to improve the lives of the local community, whether it be helping to improve the surroundings in the local school, or supporting the teaching of English to children there. #### **Languages Week**

Next week is Languages Week in the High School and will see a series of activities take place led by the English and Languages Departments and supported by the other departments within the school.

The aim of the week is to highlight the importance of the differing languages spoken and taught within our school community, and how those languages work across a range of disciplines. On Tuesday, 19 Feb, Year 7 will experience a cultural trip organised by the Languages, Humanities, Art and Science departments. Across the week, departments will be injecting their lessons with language based activities that highlight how language functions in their subject. For example, Art and Drama have collaborated on a performance where students create a character with roots in one of the languages taught at SJIIM, before creating portraits of those characters, whilst students in their P.E lessons will mentor members of the ES; History will see a focus on how the English Language was formed through Old Norse and its Viking heritage. These are but a few examples of the way the power of language will be fused into students' lessons next week, across all departments.

To conclude the week, a school book sale has been organised, with a wide range of suitable titles available to students, followed by the week's exciting conclusion: SJIIM's first Poetry Slam! This event will see students of all ages expressing themselves through poetry, working of the prompt **Speak Up, Speak Out: The Power of Language.** The students who have entered have interpreted that prompt in a range of creative and divergent ways, and as importantly have taken healthy risks in volunteering to perform in front of their peers. Though there will be a winner, the fundamental aim of the Slam is to allow students, collaboratively and individually, to use the magic of poetry to express the ways they perceive language and its importance. Already, the entrants' submissions have shown huge effort, free expression and creativity.



#### Year 12 Valentine's Day Performance

On Thursday, students from Year 12 organised a surprise musical performance at lunch time to celebrate Valentine's Day. A number of students sang and performed music for the community - we really appreciate them taking the time to prepare, perform and brighten our day.
