Lasallian Reflection from Brother Jason:

Dear Lasallians,

Before being accepted to join the Brothers' Formation Programme [which lasted for a good 7 years in total], I worked as a shipping clerk. I hated it as it was boring, repetitive and uninteresting! My first foray into the adult world of work was very different from my own exciting and eventful secondary school experience of crossing the Straits of Malacca twice a day while lugging a heavy school bag and a Great Highland bagpipe!

The dull repetitiveness of teaching in class would be apt to describe what our final Lasallian saint and patron of *Benilde House* – St Brother Benilde Romançon – had to contend with. Br Benilde overcame it creatively. Some scholars cite that he would invent creative yet practical ideas of recycling Brothers' old robes and convert them into trousers for his poorer students, as well as other ingenious ways of helping those in need.

Born in the village of Thuret in south-central France, the future Brother Benilde was so far ahead of his classmates in elementary school that when he was only fourteen years old the Brothers engaged him as a substitute teacher. Despite the objections of his parents, who wanted to keep him at home on their farm, and the reluctance of the Brothers, who felt that he was too short of stature and fail-looking, he was finally admitted to the novitiate. From 1821 to 1841 he taught successfully in the network of elementary schools conducted by the Brothers in France. No doubt, he picked up many educational experiences that shaped who he was to become.

In 1841 he was appointed as the founding *Brother Director* of a school in Saugues, an isolated village in southern France. For the next twenty years he worked quietly and effectively to educate the boys in the village and some from the neighboring farms, many of whom had never been to school before.

Small as he was, he was known as a strict but fair disciplinarian. In time, the little school became the centre of the social and intellectual life of the village, with evening classes for the adults and tutoring for the less gifted students. Brother Benilde's holiness and love of people was evident to everyone: at Mass with the students in the parish church, teaching catechism, preparing boys for first communion, visiting and praying with the sick, and rumors of near-miraculous cures. At his death more than 200 Brothers and an impressive number of priests had been his students at Saugues. At his beatification, Pope Pius XII stressed that St Benilde's holiness was attained by enduring "the terrible daily grind" yet overcoming it by "doing common things in an uncommon way."

What are our own "terrible daily grinds" that we have to face daily? And what are some creative ways can we cope with the invariable, often boring routine: by "doing common things in an uncommon way?" Well, one cute example from the LYM is the *Project Hello* initiative on Fridays. Our students hope to be putting a smile on some faces as parents and students come to school.


