### Lasallian Reflection from Brother Jason:

Dear Lasallians,

Fortunately (or unfortunately), I grew up in a family of teachers: grandmother, father, mother, aunts, uncles, cousins, and granduncles. Everyone, at some point or other, was involved with our *alma mater* St Xavier's Institution in Penang. As a teenager I would be enthralled almost every other night (when *Dallas* or *Dynasty* wasn't showing on TV) by stories of schooling life and the Brothers in St Xavier's. I remember feeling curious that each 'generation' of Xaverian in our family had a slightly different view of what *the Brother* should be. For instance, for my grandfather, the Brothers with their black robes, were bastions of discipline and shouldn't be approached unless they approach you! They were to be respected and admired from afar. That was who the Brother was in the 1920's.

My uncle had a different view of the Brothers in the 1960's and 70s: Of unique, sometimes eccentric, character, they were always very happy and happily involved with the students especially in CCAs like the school band (SXI Corps of Pipes and Drums). The story is often told of Br Charles (former Br Director of St Xavier's) who would often be seen on the school field directing the boys in the school band while they were doing formations and drills. To prove that it could be done, he was also a Malay Language SPM candidate with the inaugural cohort that had to take BM in their SPM.

The point is, the Brothers were actually involved – hands on. The saying of the day was, what they asked the children to do, they did by example too.

I am pleased to announce that our staff are keeping that tradition alive as well, in our own small way.

The Make A Difference (MAD) Professional Learning Community (PLC) – a group of teachers – after conducting site visits and needs analyses, has decided to support a Children's Shelter at nearby Kota Damansara and Taman Mayang. By passing the hat around to other staff, they plan to raise funds to systematically address the basic needs of the children there (food and toiletries) for the long term.

I am heartened to reflect that the saying of today is, what we ask the children to do, we do by example too.
