Lasallian Reflection from Brother Jason:

Dear Lasallians,

This article is being written on March 29th - a significant date for Lasallians in this part of the world.

167 years ago, an eleven-year old mostly ordinary, but smaller-than-usual, Belgian boy was a student at the Brothers' School in the town of Mellet. His mother ran a café that served Belgian ale and his father was a blacksmith. At the same time, approximately 88 kilometers away at the town of Antwerp, a rather pretty ship, the *La Julie*, was preparing to set sail with its precious cargo of six De La Salle Brothers bound for the warm climate of Asia. First arriving in colonial Singapore on March 29th, 1852, Brothers Lothaire Combes, Venere Chapuis and Jerome King made their way up north and founded St Xavier's Institution in Penang in April 1852; the other three Brothers remained in Singapore and eventually set up St Joseph's Institution there.

Perhaps from the above, we could offer this reflection: Six pioneer Brothers set sail from Europe to Asia and planted the metaphorical Lasallian seed that has now grown into quite a big Lasallian tree. Parts of that tree have grown to their full potential, served its purpose and have withered away or are in various stages of stagnation and decay. Yet other parts of that tree are sprouting new shoots. Some have planted a new tree altogether. The question that can be asked is: What are the seeds that we are sowing? Or want to sow? What are the seeds that need to be planted? And what might be some of the fruits that will be reaped in the future?

SJIIM is a young plant. With all the many service project initiatives that have been started (and more being planned) by various groups within the school community, I am amazed at how quickly our Lasallian seed is growing its first shoots and roots! De La Salle would have shared in this amazement as well.

It would be true to say that the *eleven-year old mostly ordinary, but smaller-than-usual, boy in 1852* whom I mentioned above, benefitted from our *Lasallian Tree* in Belgium. He grew up to be the future St Brother



SJIIM has a long standing relationship with the centre (going back almost three years) with the project being started by our first cohort and continued by successive cohorts. High School children can take their donations straight to the Student Wellbeing Centre on the second floor of the High School. SJIIM World Book Week 23th-26th April

The week after the Easter holiday (23-26 April) will see Elementary and High School collaborating on a series of tasks to celebrate World Book Week. This will include a series of classroom collaborations between English classes of Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 and Elementary classes of Years 1,2,3 and 4: the elder classes will work with their younger schoolmates on a divergent mix of tasks centred around the elementary class' book of choice. Year 10, for example, will work with Year 4 in understanding and developing their study of Dear Greenpeace: There's a Whale in Emily's Pond, with younger students taking a role as interviewers who 'hotseat' the elder student who takes on the part of the whale!

There will also be a book swap, and parents and students are encouraged to bring in old books which can be deposited at the front of the school, before being 'swapped' for a different book at the week's end.

The week's finale will see SJIIM's first whole school dress up day, with students and teachers in the HS able to dress up as a character of their choice from a favourite book: the students are already very excited about this and it would be wonderful if parents can support their children in finding or making a costume for Friday April 26th. Please note that if a book costume is not to be worn then students are expected to attend school in usual school uniform.

Congratulation to Nicol Yong

This past weekend, Year 13 student Nicol Yong Jia Jia won the China Daily "21st Century Cup" International English Speaking Competition in Hangzhou, Zhejiang province. With more than 31 competitors from 30 different countries and regions, the competition was fierce. In fact, the second prize winner hailing from China is a final year English Literature student at Tsinghua University. Even though Nicol was one of the youngest competitors, she showcased three character traits that allowed her to stand out from the rest: firstly, Nicol spent hours rehearsing and applying feedback to her speeches prior to presenting them; secondly, her flexibility and willingness to reflect allowed her to make last-minute changes moments before going on-stage; and finally, she displayed confidence all throughout her performance, using humour and vulnerability to engage the audience. The topics of the speeches were: "let us be true to one another" and "the great truth is simple". You can read more about the competition here. Additionally, on the same day she won the competition, she also found out that she was accepted into Yale-NUS in Singapore, which offers her dream programme of study.
