SJII MAI AYSIA

St. Joseph's Institution International Malaysia (SJII Malaysia) opened its doors to students in August 2016 with 430 students and has now grown to over 800 students in its fourth academic year. Over the past 3, more than 70 scholarships have been awarded to deserving students to embark on the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme in our school. We can already see the potential in our students to be leaders in the fields they aim to pursue upon graduation and we have high hopes for their success in the future. From our first graduated cohort, 2 students obtained 44 out of 45 points with over 30% of them scoring 40 points and above. In addition to this, 46% of our scholars also went on to receive scholarships from foreign universities. They are currently enrolled at New York University Abu Dhabi, Imperial College London, University of Pennsylvania, University of British Columbia, Tsinghua University, Nanyang Technological University and Osaka University to name a few. We had equally good IBDP results in 2019 with the top student scoring 44 points while our school's IBDP results average of 37.5 points were amongst the highest in Malaysia.

SJII Malaysia was established by the alumni of SJI Singapore. The aim being to remain true to the mission of the Founder, St. John Baptist De La Salle which is to provide quality values-based, holistic education for the young. Instilling the core values of Faith, Service and Community is at the heart of this institution producing servant-leaders in the society. To teach minds, touch hearts and transform lives is the main goal of SJII Malaysia and we do hope that every member of our community, enters to learn and leaves to serve.



St Joseph's Institution International Malaysia offers scholarships to students entering Year 12 in August 2020.

Merit-based and means-tested Scholarships are awarded based on:

- · SJII Malaysia's scholarship assessment test
- an interview with the Scholarship Panel
- · a written personal statement
- · the student's current school academic records
- an endorsement from the Principal of the applicant's current school

These scholarships cover all or part of the application fee, enrolment fee, security deposit, and tuition fees for 2 years according to the percentage of the award. The scholarships are normally within a range of 25% - 100%. The applicant's family financial background will be considered for the quantum of the final scholarship offered.



Applications close on Saturday, 1st February 2020.
Scholarship tests will take place on Friday, 14th February 2020.
Shortlisted applicants will be notified on Monday, 24th February 2020.
Shortlisted applicants will attend a selection interview on Wednesday, 26th February 2020.
Applicants can expect to know the results by Wednesday, 4th March 2020.
Participation in the Lasallian camp in August 2020.
