Coronavirus Update

Guidelines 2019 Novel Coronavirus (Covid-19) Management in Malaysia by Ministry of Health Malaysia and the Malaysian Society of OSH (MSOSH) "

a) Monitor body temperature and look out for fever (≥ 38°C), and symptoms of cough with breathless within the last 14 days of visit to affected area/ countries or close contact with confirmed case.

b) Cover mouth and nose by using tissue whenever coughing or sneezing. Throw the tissue in the waste bin after use. Wash hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer regularly.

c) Always follow cough etiquettes.

d) Use face mask if you are not feeling well whenever in public places or close contact with people;

- e) Always maintain good personal hygiene and cleanliness.
- f) All PPE and clothing used must be washed with clean water and detergent.
- g) Refrain from consuming raw animal product or half cook poultry meat.

Once again, thank you for your support. We will no longer be checking the entire school's temperature as we have exceeded the 14 days quarantine period since we returned to school. We will however, continue to check Nursery and Reception children as was normal practice prior to the outbreak of the coronavirus. 

Safe School Update This week: 10 tips for parents to help children stay safe online

- 1. You should only talk to people you know and trust in real life anyone can pretend to be a child online
- If you do talk to people you don't know, don't give away personal information like what street you live on or where you go to school, or share your location with them. Say no to any requests they send you for images or videos of yourself, and stop talking to them
- 3. Set your profiles to private, to limit what others can see
- 4. Be 'share aware' think carefully about what you share and with who. Once it's out there, you've got no control over what the other person does with it. Remember, it's illegal to take, share or view sexual images of under-18s, full stop
- 5. Be mindful of your digital footprint. What you post online now could come back to bite you later, like when applying for jobs, college or university
- 6. If you see something upsetting, or someone bullies you, tell an adult you trust
- 7. Be aware that people will try to make their lives look more exciting online. There's a lot people can do with photo editing to make their photos look better. So don't assume everything you see is a true to life representation
- Watch out for hoaxes and scams, like messages you're meant to forward on or that ask you for payment details or your password
- Take any content that glamorises gang lifestyles with a very large pinch of salt it's not as glamorous as it looks. Be wary of schemes promising easy cash for receiving and transferring money too, they're almost definitely criminal activity
- 10. Watch out for loot boxes or other parts of games where you pay money to take a chance on getting a reward
 you can get sucked into spending lots of money on them
