# SJIIM Weekly Update 11th September 2020



### Our Youngest Students are Settling in!

The youngest children at SJIIM have had a great start to school! Everyone has been very keen to interact after such a long time without socialisation, which has been lovely to see! The children who were in Nursery last year were extremely excited to start Reception and catch up with their school friends, whilst the new Nursery and Reception children have been eager to explore their new learning environment.

The children are getting reacquainted with school routines and learning new habits based around the 'new norm'. Following our typical practice, the students followed a 'staggered start', meaning they come to school in small groups to begin the year.

This was especially beneficial this year to teach them how to keep themselves safe with our new routines, eg. frequent washing hands and sitting on marked areas. Exposure to these new routines, environments and expectations in smaller groups enabled the children to adjust quicker and more comfortably. It is also a chance for the teachers to get to know each individual child and help them settle happily into school. The 'staggered start' was particularly helpful to the new Nursery children as it gave them a chance to develop confidence and become used to longer hours at school.

All the children have been getting to know each other and have enjoyed showing their Marvellous Me boxes with others, sharing their favourite toys and photographs from home. They have already had a taste of specialist lessons - joining in with Mr. Clement's singing, Ms. Grace and Mr. Tom's dancing, Ms. Pardo's drama and the Mandarin team's sessions. The children have also loved listening to stories at the end of each day and visiting the Library to choose their first book to take home.

We are extremely impressed with how grown up the children have been, walking themselves into school and waving goodbye to their parents at the Rainbow Gates. The staff are thoroughly enjoying getting to know the children better and are eager to continue to watch them grow and develop throughout the academic year.









### Assembly programme in Action

Our school assembly programme forms an important part of our character educations, as well as PSHCE (Personal, health, spiritual and citizenship education) programmes. We are delighted that we have been able to redesign the programme so this important part of our whole school education can continue. Pupils now have year group assemblies in the Auditorium weekly, in socially-distanced seating arrangements. For our Friday phase assemblies, we are now coming together on Zoom. The theme for this year is all about creativity and flexibility! This week, we have been exploring our Virtues and we have helped to develop children's understanding of our upcoming holiday, Malaysia Day!

### <u>Bahasa Homework</u>

Every school year, we seek to review our curriculum and continue to develop and improve what we offer SJIIM students. To help further support students progress and learning in Bahasa, we will begin setting all children Bahasa home learning tasks weekly. These tasks will focus on the speaking and listening aspects of their learning and help the children gain confidence, so they can show off what they know!

### Dropping off items in the day - Reminder

Movement around school is more highly regulated at the moment, and staff are extremely busy with all of the extra supervision required to ensure your children are safe and as active as possible, within the government's SOPs. As you know, parents are not allowed on site, as per the MOE guidelines. For these reasons, we are unable to accept items dropped off from home during the school day (lunches, books, etc).

### Note about procedures of unwell children

Although we would like all children to attend school daily, the choices parents make when sending children to school, during these unprecedented times, could have impacts on the whole school community. Please make decisions around your child's health and attendance in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Students with any symptoms of Covid-19 at home should not be sent to the school. Parents must inform the school and must produce a medical certificate from a doctor before returning to school.
- Students with any symptoms of Covid-19 sent home from school will be dismissed to parents with a clear explanation. Students can only return to school after 24 hours with no fever (and no fever-reducing medication) and should produce a medical certificate from a doctor before returning to school.
- When returning to school students must come to the Medical Room first to consult with the nurse before entering the classroom.
- Students with siblings: if sibling (1) has a fever and sibling (2) has no symptoms of Covid-19, sibling 2 still can proceed to the classroom.

### \*Covid 19 symptoms include: Fever (temp above 37.5), Flu, Cough, Sore Throat or Shortness of breath

Allowing these two year groups will keep numbers low, in line with government SOP's and also provides students in these year group with an opportunity to demonstrate their virtue of responsibility.

### SPARK - CAS Project and YouTube Channel

One of the exciting opportunities afforded by CAS (Creativity, Activity and Service) in the IB Diploma Programme is the expectation for students to complete at least one "CAS project" during their IBDP studies. In most years, the Year 12 students complete their CAS project through collaboratively planning a 'Challenge Week' trip in early July to another part of Malaysia or abroad, and taking part in activities related to all three strands of CAS. Due to the MCO, they were not able to complete this trip in July 2020. However, although the MCO brought challenges for students to be able to carry out CAS activities, it also sparked a wealth of creative responses from students, who planned alternative projects, designed to enrich not only their own learning but that of others as well.

With the need for independent learning becoming more prevalent in their current circumstances, a group of Y13 students - Chan Jing Yuan, Tiffany Chin, Anjeli Estrada, Alvin Ooi, Alithea Pentadu, and Chin Xuen Bei - started a student-led initiative to spread knowledge in various fields of knowledge. From this shared vision of kindling an interest in academia, SPARK was created as a month-long project, with their team creating intellectually stimulating videos explaining interesting concepts in medicine, neurobiology & anatomy, chemical & biomedical engineering, physics and maths. They hope that this project demonstrates to viewers that learning is a lifelong process that transcends adversity.
