A welcome message from our Head of School, Mdm Mak Lai Ying Frances

The last few months were extraordinary times for the world. I was in Singapore and I went through the "circuit breaker" for longer than two months. Social interactions were only allowed for people staying in the same household, but I live alone. Dining out was not an option. All the condo facilities – the swimming pool and the gym – were closed. Then I arrived in KL on 31 July and I completed my quarantine on 14 August. During my quarantine, I was on my own in the hotel room.

I am glad that over the years I have developed different interests. I am also open to doing things I have not done before. I have always loved reading. I read English and Chinese materials. I learnt how to play the piano 4 years ago and piano playing has given me much joy. During the "circuit breaker" period in Singapore, I tried for the first time working with nanoblocks. I also spent more time praying and talking to God. My family, friends and I exchanged encouraging messages.

I worked from the hotel during my quarantine. During that time, I got to know SJIIM better through the teachers and administrative colleagues. They have been working hard to ensure that the school is safe for all of us. Our students are very blessed to have all the teachers and colleagues looking out for them.

I hope all of us have learnt more about ourselves during the last few months, when we have all had to live, work and play differently. How we manage challenges depends on the character traits and life skills – resilience, empathy, ability to deal with ambiguity, self-regulation, knowing where/who to get support, developing strong family relationships and friendships – that we develop over the years. A strong relationship with God is also very important.

This academic year of 2020/2021 will also require all of us to adjust to new norms. We will all have to play our part to ensure that the SJIIM community is COVID free and that we all remain safe and well. I have heard from the teachers that we have good and responsible students. I am confident that all of us will have a very productive year.

Your Support

Starting the year with routines that will set the tone for optimal student learning and wellness is the goal of staff and parents alike. As always, we would appreciate your support in some areas that will keep our students happy, healthy and ready to learn. Please ensure that your child arrives on time to optimize learning and that you are prompt for pick up to promote health and safety. Consistency in following pick up and drop off time frames will support the necessary physical distancing protocols that our new staggered arrival and dismissal schedule provides. Elementary School students not picked up by 3:05 will be sent to the ES office.

Although we would like all children to attend school daily, the choices parents make when sending children to school, during these unprecedented times, could have impacts on the whole school community. Please make decisions around your child's health and attendance in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Students with any symptoms of Covid-19 at home should not be sent to the school. Parents must inform the school and must produce a medical certificate from a doctor before returning to school.
- Students with any symptoms of Covid-19 sent home from school will be dismissed to parents with a clear explanation. Students can only return to school after 24 hours with no fever (and no fever-reducing medication) and should produce a medical certificate from a doctor before returning to school.
- When returning to school students must come to the Medical Room first to consult with the nurse before entering the classroom.
- Students with siblings: if sibling (1) has a fever and sibling (2) has no symptoms of Covid-19, sibling 2 still can proceed to the classroom.
