Bahasa in the Elementary School

In the Elementary School, we focus on the "automatising" of high-frequency words and developing an understanding of language patterns in the Malay language. Students focus on learning vocabulary in "chunks", testing what they have learnt in blocks through the practice of four key skills in language acquisition; listening, speaking, reading and writing. This enables a deeper understanding of the structure of the language.

Our curriculum is based on the IGCSE syllabus but pitched at an Elementary School level. We follow the same topics for all the classes in a particular year group, with differentiated instruction and difficulty levels according to ability.

We also work very closely with the HS Bahasa teachers to ensure a smooth transition and progression of learning in the High School. This is done through project based group learning, collaboration and learning walks between the ES and HS teachers as well as with teachers from other international schools through our membership of the Association of International Malaysian Schools (AIMS) network. We enjoy the opportunities we have of observing our colleagues from different schools and gain valuable and positive input that helps us develop our lessons, making them both fun and enjoyable for the students.

Further development in the subject has seen weekly home learning commence for all students from Years 1 - 6. Home learning is given in the form of online games such as Quizlet, Quizziz and Wordwall as well as follow up activities set in Google Classroom or Seesaw. This has brought about noticable changes in the students' mastery of vocabulary as they find it easier to retain the information learned. Although there have been some challenges due to the pandemic and virtual learning, we still see great progress in students' knowledge and understanding of the language.

"I have tried ordering food in Bahasa in a restaurant and I manage to order food correctly and help my father pay the bill later on." (Year 5 student)




The heavens are yours; the earth also is yours; the world and all that is in it, you have founded them.


