They were both indifferent to the situation. While the Samaritan and the victim were total strangers to one another, yet the former is willing to take that bold step to ensure his "brother" is safe and well again.

"Love does not care where someone is from. Instead, it builds bridges." When St. John Baptist de La Salle was invited to manage a school for poor boys in Rheims, it was the start of building bridges between the uneducated and the educated in French society. You are the fortunate Lasallians who can afford an international education and like the priest and the scholar, you will "fly" to be men and women of substance. Our Lasallian education is not just on academic success but also nurturing a lifelong feeling of compassion to lift the fallen.

On behalf of the other members of the Board and my fellow Brothers of the Christian Schools, I thank the administrators especially Ms Frances Mak, teachers, admin assistants and parents for your support of the Josephians entrusted to our care.

To our graduating Josephians, we wish you Godspeed in whatever the choices you make in the next chapter of your lives.


Catholic Corner







New Mathematics Curriculum for Students in Years 7 & 8

As a Maths department, we are continually reviewing our curriculum to ensure that it is up to date with modern educational research and that it provides our students with the best mathematics education that we can provide them in order to help them achieve their full potential. Over the past couple of years we have been developing a new curriculum to do exactly this.

We are excited to be launching our new year 7 and 8 curriculum next year which is designed to develop deeper thinking and higher order critical thinking for our students in order to better prepare them for the iGCSE and IB programmes, as well as encourage a greater foundation of understanding with mathematics.

The Maths curriculum for other year groups will remain unchanged, so we will continue to have an accelerated path for students who show the potential to do well in the IGCSE assessments a year early. However this will now start in Year 9 as opposed to Year 8, allowing the Maths department to make more informed decisions regarding the streaming.

As part of this planning for the updated curriculum in Years 7 and 8, and with the collaboration and support from Corbett Maths, we have written our own student independent textbooks to help support students' learning and these are currently being printed by the bookshop and will be available for sale from them soon.

There will be a virtual information event taking place on the 29th June and invites for this will be shared with the parents of current Year 6 and Year 7 students.


