Maths anxiety

Maths anxiety is real. It isn't uncommon to feel a sense of fear when attempting maths problems or using mental maths skills to quickly solve problems in everyday life. Some students and adults may experience challenges engaging their working memory when working with maths and this can be a result of maths anxiety.

This can result in people believing that they aren't a "maths person" and developing this shield as a coping mechanism when they feel regularly challenged and anxious when working with maths.

As teachers in the Maths department we work hard supporting students with maths anxiety to develop a growth mindset and believe in themselves. We also get a lot of requests from parents wondering how they can help support their students when they themselves feel like they aren't a "maths person".

One of the online programmes we have been working with throughout the past few years, Eedi (home of diagnostic questions), has put together the following free 25 minute course for Maths-anxious Parents, "Helping with Homework: For Maths-Anxious Parents". They have also put together the following free 30 minute course for students with maths anxiety.
