Message from Mr Chris Woodhams (The Dean: ES Assessment, Learning Technology & Specialist Subjects)

I have always been motivated in my career by the idea of public service. Before teaching, I worked in a government agency in London. It was there that my interest in education began. I became involved in a new government initiative called 'Every Child Matters'. I was on the pathway towards a public sector consultancy career, but this child centred initiative inspired me to change my direction. More and more, I found that I wanted to get to the 'front line', and have a positive daily impact in children's lives; teaching was the answer.

I have since enjoyed a wonderful career in education and I find real satisfaction in knowing that everything I do at work is about achieving the best outcomes for children; academically, socially and spiritually.

Teaching internationally was also something that I aspired to early on, and the decision to move to an international school in Shanghai, led to meeting my wife, who was also starting at the school. After Shanghai, we moved to a school in Penang, and spent three very happy years there. I am always proud to say our son Finley was born in Penang (and he is too!).

Our time in Penang gave us a strong connection to Malaysia; it's people and food probably being the things we like most! After a few years reconnecting with family, friends and the education system back in the UK, we welcomed the chance to return to Malaysia and join St Joseph's.

What set St Joseph's apart from other international schools was the genuine values based culture and emphasis on character development. This was clear when we met the Founding Elementary School Principal, Mrs Quigley in London. She understood the high standards (and high stakes) of schools in the UK but was creating a school where child wellbeing and character development were prioritised and underpinned everything the school was about. This echoed with my hopes and aspirations for my next school, as a teacher and as a parent.

Away from work, sport and outdoor activities are a big part of my life. I've played rugby, since I was a teenager and I'm really happy to be part of a playing community here in KL. The camaraderie and friendships I've enjoyed through this sport are things I really value, and now, playing veterans rugby, I have the added bonus of being one of the youngest on the team!



Kangaroo Maths Competition 2021


Despite the many challenges of MCO 3.0, many of our students sat the Kangaroo Maths Competition from home at the end of last academic year and we are extremely proud of our students for the determination shown in sitting these challenging maths papers in such challenging times.

At the end of September the results were officially announced and we are excited to share with you how well our students have done. We had 59 students achieve an Honorable mention, placing them in the top 50% of candidates in their age group.

We also have the pleasure of announcing a number of medalists from our school. The top 10% of participants from each category are the MEDALISTS. From here, the top 1.3% will receive a **GOLD MEDAL**, the next 3.3% will receive a SILVER MEDAL and the remaining 5.4% will receive a BRONZE MEDAL.

The following <u>table</u> shows which students achieved honorable mentions and medals. We are extremely proud of all of our students and look forward to carrying on this success when we enter the Kangaroo Maths Competition again this academic year.
