Message from Dale Stacey - Leader of Teaching & Learning (HS)

Head of Music (ES)

All teachers are Performers...

Since before I can remember, I have always loved performing. It started early. An obsession with Musicals, theatre production, dance, comedy... any type of performance I was drawn to. At one point I even wanted to be a magician in the 'Magic Circle'! Recognising this passion, I went to drama groups, studied the keyboard, took dance lessons and later, as a teenager, formed my first band and started down my journey of education in Drama and Music. This led me to follow a BA in Music in the city where Pop Music started, the home of the Beatles: Liverpool. My career path after university saw me working with some of the biggest bands of the early '00s as a sound engineer, working at large venues across the UK, whilst also pursuing my passion to make it big with own my band. Music even led me to my wife, whom I met at a music festival!

Through working with the industry, it was when working with young bands and musicians that I found true job satisfaction. Realising my calling, I trained to be a Music teacher. I understood that encouraging younger generations to find a passion for music was something that gave me as much, if not more, joy than performing myself. To develop their understanding of the principles of music appraisal and develop a life-long passion for music, whilst pushing the boundaries of their abilities, gave me the same adrenaline rush as before walking on stage. Music, as with all Arts, is a great exponent of values-based education; where students not only learn the skills and knowledge of the subject, but also those of courage, resilience, integrity, communication and so much more. Imparting these lifelong skills had far more importance.

The driving force behind me is my family, which grew alongside my teaching career. Moving abroad was a big step for us, with an 8 and 3 year-old, but we took the leap in 2018. Our decision to move our family across the world stemmed from the hope of opportunity; to see the world, to give our children a more holistic education and to give them a wider world view. Malaysia has more than fulfilled on its promises, with its food, its disparate landscapes to explore, its flora and fauna to inspire, and the warmth from its many cultures. We were drawn to St Joseph's with its promise of a values-based education, high aspiration for all students to achieve their individual best, and its Lasallian values. These aspects are important to us as a family and the values are those which we wish to impart to our children, as well as the students in the school community.



If 'All the World's a stage', when I was younger I craved the 'limelight'. Now, I have learnt to be more fulfilled by playing a 'supporting role' - to my family, to the staff and to the students of our school community.


