Message from Joel Lawrence, Head of Maths.

Sport has always been a major passion of mine. As a student I enjoyed representing my school in a variety of sports and these experiences made up some of my greatest memories from school. The recent announcement of the return of CCA's and sporting opportunities for our students should be welcomed with great excitement and optimism for the possibilities and opportunities that sport can bring to our community.

The various movement control orders across Malaysia and the rest of the world brought a halt to sport for students and athletes around the world for a small period of time in 2020. However, with the introduction of 'bubbles' and the creativity of league leaders around the world, sport quickly made a phased return to our lives. We experienced international events postponed to 2021, including the Tokyo Olympics which I know brought some normality, hope and cheer to our summer of MCOs or quarantines.

As a spectator I find particular enjoyment in analysing possible outcomes from events within a game as well as the strategies that teams can apply in order to obtain an advantage over their opponents. In my earliest memories of spectating sport, I thoroughly enjoyed calculating the different combinations of unconverted tries (5 points), converted tries (7 points) or penalties/drop goals (3 points) required for rugby teams to muster up a comeback or take a 3-point lead in the dying moments of extra-time during a world cup final.



As my passions with mathematics my appreciation grew, for the mathematics in sport grew with it and I found myself becoming a keen enthusiast for Formula 1 racing. In 2008 I enjoyed the triumph of Lewis Hamilton winning his first driver's championship by 1 point over Filipe Massa. The thrills of that F1 season, bringing us a great British prodigy of motor racing, was made all the more memorable by the fact that at the time I was working in a kitchen with a Brazilian head chef who was also an F1 fanatic. Sport continues to show its ability to bring communities together.

13 years later, the F1 world finds itself walking into possibly the best season finale since the days of Senna and Prost. With Lewis Hamilton competing for his record breaking 8th Driver's Championship Title and Max Verstappen entering the scene for his first shot at glory, the two fierce rivals can not be separated by even half a point after 21 races and all will be decided this weekend in Abu Dhabi.

My enjoyment of F1 is supported by my love of maths and physics. Every race offers new excitement of the unknown, and I thoroughly enjoy trying to analyse the mathematics and physics that plays it's part in trying to predict or strengthen teams' opportunities as they compete. In just a pit stop alone there are statisticians and physicists working behind the scenes, evaluating the degradation of tyres alongside the estimated exit time and also the strategy of timing your stop around your opponents' brings game theory into the mix that is already dense with mathematical analysis. All of this thought goes into a 24 second stop that could be the difference between winning the race or having to retire due to a tyre blow out.

Off the track the research and development teams are putting in the hours, adjusting the car by the smallest of margins to improve its performance on straights without sacrificing their ability around corners. The FIA (officials) are continually reflecting on the rules around the design of cars looking to improve the quality and speed of the racing without putting the drivers at more risk. The success of this was shown in Italy with Lewis Hamilton's Halo potentially saving his life. The car changes for next season will cause the flow of dirty air to be projected higher, allowing for opponents to get closer behind before overtaking without it affecting their car performance.

There is so much mathematics in F1 and we can all find opportunities for mathematical analysis in our hobbies or passions and this is the challenge that our IBDP students must look into for their Internal Assessments. This year we have students exploring the optimization of coffee packaging, the normal distribution applied to golf club selection, using regression analysis to evaluate and predict the movements of financial markets and many more. It is great to see our students applying mathematics to their passions and I hope that these opportunities can give them more appreciation for these as well as mathematics.

Drama submissions: monologue/duologue either written by a student or a professional


Dance submissions: performance of any style
