# Message from David Fitzgerald (Head of Year Two and EYFS/KS1 Maths Lead)

At University, I studied History and English at the University of Derby. These subjects had always been my favourite at school and continuing my education in these areas had always appealed to me. During my degree, I did some volunteer work in a school and loved it, everyday was so unique and the career seemed so rewarding. Straight after University, I began my PGCE at Newman University College in Birmingham and it is the best decision I have ever made.

Following the completion of my teacher training, I spent one year in Thailand teaching English as an additional language. I spent nine months based in a quiet part of Thailand around one hour north of Bangkok. This was my first experience outside of Europe and ignited my love of travel and in particular the food of South East Asia. I taught all year groups from ages 3 - 18 and class sizes ranging from 15 - 90. This was definitely a steep learning curve for a newly qualified teacher. Learning to teach children across a language barrier helped me learn so much as a teacher. My time in Thailand was pivotal in helping me develop my teaching style going forward.

When I returned to the UK, I moved back to my home city of Birmingham where I taught at a one-form entry Catholic school. During this time, I had the opportunity to teach in Menorca in the Canary Islands as part of an EU funded Erasmus program. This scheme was an incredible opportunity to meet teachers from across Europe and learn about the pedagogy in their home countries.

After Birmingham, I moved to London, where I lived for four years. I thoroughly enjoyed my time in London. From a teaching perspective, I discovered my love for mathematics through the South West Maths Mastery Hub which was focused on developing the teaching of mastery mathematics in UK schools. From a personal point of view, the access to live sports was incredible. I was lucky enough to go to Wimbledon, Twickenham and Wembley to name a few.

### The Origin of Red Envelopes (红包)

The earliest form of Chinese New Year (CNY) money dates back to the Han Dynasty (206 BC -220 AD) when money in red envelopes was not a currency, but was in the form of coins to ward off the evil spirits. After 1912, the money was gradually converted from coins to banknotes, and parents then began to use new banknotes with consecutive numbers as a way of saying "growing up successively."




#### Chinese New Year (CNY) 2022 Celebrations


#### **CNY** celebrations and performance


# Student Led Conferences (Years 7 to 13) and Parent Teacher Conferences (Years 11 to 13) Thursday, 24 February


