Message from Ms. Sarah Sousa, Humanities Teacher and Head of Year 7

Teaching adds value to my life, it is a passion which allows me to continuously grow and develop as an individual, acting as a vocation which allows me to continuously reflect, discover and flourish.

I am lucky enough to have been pursuing this passion for 9 years; 1,440 days and counting. Every life event, every experience I have gone through, every hiccup and happy tear shed, has helped me to better develop myself as an individual and therefore emulate those teachings, understandings and practices back into my classroom - alwaying me to always improve upon and grow within my abilities as an educator.

From a young age, I knew I wanted to become a teacher. I always look back on this fact and consider myself quite lucky to have not only followed through with this dream, but to more importantly, genuinely enjoyed the outcome!

To help my youthful aspirations take form, I attended McMaster University, in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada (my hometown). I studied here for 4 years and gained my Honors Bachelor of Arts, majoring in History and minoring in Geography and Religious Studies. After garnering my B of A,

I went to the University of Toronto (located in Toronto, Ontario) to complete my Bachelors of Education - majoring in Intermediate/Senior Studies with qualifications to teach History and Religious Studies. I applied to various schools in Asia and was lucky enough to receive a job offer at St Joseph's International School in Malaysia, where I have been working as a KS3 Humanities and High School History teacher for the last 3 years.

Throughout my teaching career, I have also been fortunate enough to gain experience and grow within the fields of Student Well-being, Student Services and Pastoral Care. I have worked under many different titles, and have learned many different approaches. Regardless of the title, working within the field of Student Well-being has added greater purpose to my journey as an educator. I love supporting students academically within the classroom, but I know it is working with students pastorally, helping them navigate their emotions, bettering their personal understandings and guiding them to stand up for their own needs and wants, which has added the ultimate layer of satisfaction to my journey. Currently I am applying to complete a Masters in Educational Psychology, which I hope will only help to further my quest for knowledge and solidify myself within the world of Student Well-being.



As we are competing for our houses on Tuesday, students are invited to wear their house colours.




Puzzle of the week

Puzzle of the week is back. After the first few days of competition, SJIIM sit in the top 10 for schools around the world. It would be great if we could climb a little higher this weekend.


All members of our school community (including parents) are encouraged to get involved by registering and entering on the competition <u>website</u>. The first puzzle is below and is available until Sunday.

Parents with children in Years 10 and 9 are invited to join us for a virtual launch of our exciting plans for Year 12 from August/September 2023.


