Message from Mrs Victoria Stacey Head of Y11, Teacher of Lasallian Education

This time four years ago we were living in our dream home set in a lovely part of north Liverpool. My children attended wonderful schools, and Mr Stacey and I were extremely happy in our teaching roles. My parents lived around the corner and helped us on a full-time basis with childcare; it was a happy, comfortable life. The decision to leave this all behind and move to Malaysia was not an easy one and it certainly shocked family, friends and colleagues in the UK! The idea of leaving a happy life behind has impacted how we have viewed the opportunities that we have been afforded through international teaching; it was never about escapism or finding something better, it was about growing as a family through new challenges and experiences. We were married and became parents in our early twenties meaning that we didn't quite manage the round the world trip we had planned! There was always this itch, a recurring conversation that we would return to - what if we moved abroad and tried out international teaching? When I told my parents that we were moving to Malaysia they were shocked, but they did not discourage our decision or try to persuade us otherwise. My parents have always guided me to be the best version of myself, never comparing my journey to others, allowing me to flourish into the best that I can be. Four years later, they still continue to put their feelings aside and put mine and my family's interest first - unconditional, selfless love.

So, off we went! Thankfully, we made the right decision and the experience has most definitely been worth the risk! The greatest blessing that I am thankful for each day is the opportunity to be a parent teacher. I still get emotional when I cross the bridge and catch a glimpse of Isabella and Jude swimming with their school friends. I know that working parents often miss out on sports days, performances etc. I certainly did when we lived in the UK, so I cherish those moments and always try to remember how lucky I am to see my own children flourish at SJIIM. For me, the opportunity to spend time with your family in one school community is a unique experience, one that has brought us closer together and something that I know will stay with us all forever.

Since becoming a teacher, I have always tried to treat young people as I would treat my own children, understanding what a privilege it is to nurture young minds and hearts. My ultimate goal as a teacher is to guide young people to realise their potential, in the same way my parents did for me. St Catherine of Siena puts it beautifully, "Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire." We all have to discern our path in in life. For some it is easier than others. For me, the people in my chosen photographs continue to inspire me every day to be the best I can as a parent, teacher, wife and daughter.
