International Women's Day 2023

Despite the many inspirational women who have excelled in sport and science, there is still a lack of female participation in these fields. There are a number of factors that contribute to this, including a lack of visible role models, gender stereotypes, and a lack of access to resources.

One of the primary reasons why more women don't enter into sport and science is a lack of visible role models. Women in these fields are often not as celebrated or as visible as their male counterparts. This is especially true in science, where the majority of publications are still authored by men. Equally, the viewers of the Women's World Cup in football is just 31% of the mens', which is echoed by the discrepancy in the women's \$23m prize pot, in comparison to the men's colossal \$400m (2019 figures).

Ultimately, in order to increase female participation in sport and science, it is important to create a more equal playing field (forgive the pun!) by providing more visible role models and challenging gender stereotypes.

Here are some of our own Year 10s to talk about breaking their own glass ceiling in sport and science, as well as the women that inspired them along the way.



Maya Fedorowicz on women in sport

Womens sport - specifically women's football - is an ever growing industry, and although leaps of progress have been made in recent years there is still a stark difference between women's and men's sports. For instance, the majority of people in our school will have watched or heard about the men's world cup that happened in 2022, though I find almost no one knows or is talking about the upcoming women's world cup that is happening this year. Many people may be familiar with Watson and Crick's research on the structure of human DNA. Some may also be familiar with Rosalind Franklin, whose findings with X-ray crystallography were instrumental in this influential discovery. However, she had not received the credit she deserved for her work until years later. Sadly, many female scientists have experienced something similar, especially in the past, where their work has gone unnoticed in favour of discoveries made by their male counterparts.
