"Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve"

Message by Mr Chris Woodhams, ES Assistant Principal - Academic "House Saint Days"

Today marked the first House event for the new academic year; Saint Jaime Day. This tradition started last year, with each House having one day a year in honour of their Saint. On Saints' Days, all members of the House come to school dressed in their House colours, with students from other Houses asked to wear an accessory of that colour. For each Saint Day, the House Captains (newly elected each year) are tasked with planning activities for the day - a responsibility that helps build their leadership skills, promote character education and develop our sense of community. House Captain's are elected by the children for each year group from year 6 through to year 13 with two staff Heads of House, one for the Elementary School and one for High School. Activities on Saint's Days are structured around 3 key themes which align well with our school ethos: knowledge, service and sport. The knowledge component allows all students to develop a deeper understanding of the Saints themselves, each of whom is a Lasallian Brother who has been proclaimed a Saint.







St Jaime, was born on 2 January, 1898 in northern Spain. He attended a religious school and began his ecclesial study in 1911. However, he soon developed hearing problems and was forced to withdraw. In 1917, he became a novice of the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools and was given the religious name Jaime Hilario. He was sent on various teaching assignments until 1933 when his hearing problems worsened and was forced to work as a gardener. He was arrested in mid-1936 during the Spanish Civil War for being a member of a religious congregation. Although he could have claimed that he was a gardener, he insisted that he was a La Salle Brother and was convicted. His courage carried him through two rounds of bullets from a firing squad. He was only martyred on January 18, 1937 when the firing squad commander shot him five times in close range.

Today we honoured Saint Jaime's Spanish heritage with the House Captains creating some delicious Spanish tapas which were shared generously with students at break time. In class, students developed their knowledge of St Jaime by playing a Kahoot quiz and they also practised service by taking 5 minutes of the day to tidy up their classrooms. Service and sport were combined together in the activities the House Captains led at lunch time. Our younger children were entertained with an obstacle course in Early Years and colouring in Jaime's Malaysian animal mascot; the sun bear. Others took part in 'tug o wars' on the field and many enjoyed the ingenious 'telematch relays' on the basketball court. Students were also offered red ribbons to wear throughout the day. A sincere thank you to all the House Captains and Leaders for all their hard work in organising these events for the school community.

In order to achieve an Honorable Mention students need to be in the top 50% of the participants in their category with the top 10% of students receiving Gold, Silver or Bronze medals.

IGCSE Geography trip

On Friday, 30/9/22, all IGCSE Geography students went on a trip to the Sungai Inki in Kalumpang as part of their studies on river systems. This was the first Geography field trip since early 2020! While there, students engaged in some light fieldwork in the river. They measured the speed of flow, the width and depth of the channel, and the type of rocks that are prevalent on the river bed. Students then compared how the two sections of the river compare in terms of these measurements. Though we did get rained out toward the end of the tasks, we were already as wet as it is possible to get after completing the fieldwork activities! We arrived back at school at about 5:30pm exhausted, but having had a great time in Kalumpang! As time goes on, we in the Humanities Department hope to re-normalise regular field trips to provide more fun, engaging and meaningful learning experiences to our students.









IB Geography field trip

The Year 13 IB Geographers had a fantastic field trip, following the MRT line from Bukit Bintang to Kota Damansara, collecting data and taking measurements along the way. After a brief planning meeting at a city centre coffee shop, Sarah, Shane, Jynez and Maira set about completing various surveys, measurements and observations including building height, air pollution and noise levels. Superbly organised, and working well as a team, they collected a vast amount of data and worked tenaciously up until a well deserved lunch at 1Utama. Following lunch they completed the necessary data collection at Kota Damansara station. Mr Weatherup and Mr Taylor were in agreement that the pupils had conducted themselves superbly throughout the day and I think a fantastic day of experiential learning, seeing and doing Geography, was had by all.
