Parent Prayer Circle

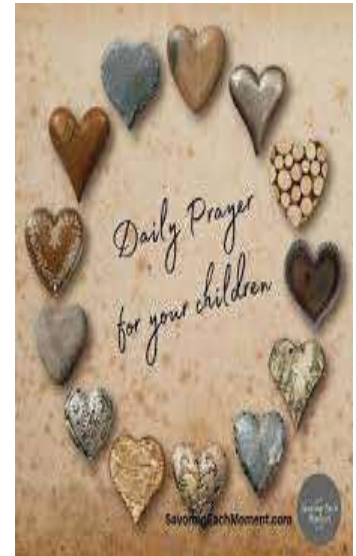
Our 'Parent Prayer Circle' for September will be postponed to the 6th October due to the delay of Eucharistic Mass which will take place on 28th Sept.

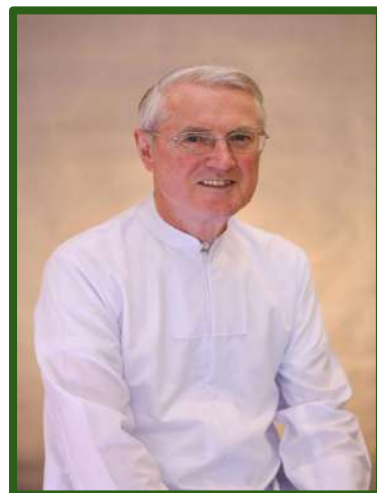

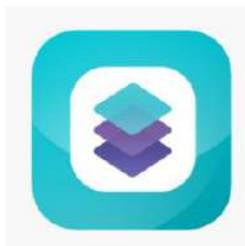
