WS Instrumental music Recital

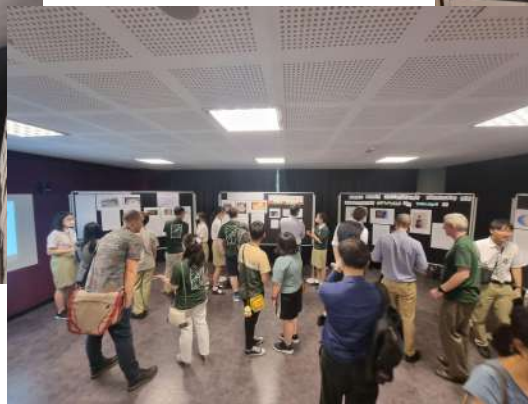

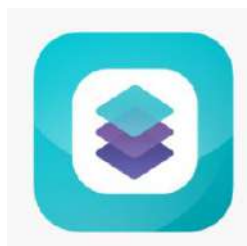
