## Duke of Edinburgh's International Award - Bronze Qualifying Expedition

Forty students from SJIIM participated in their Bronze Qualifying Expedition for their Duke of Edinburgh's International Award on 15th-16th of June. This was their final expedition that followed on from a practice expedition earlier in the year.

The aim of the expedition programme was for students to develop team participation skills including reading route cards and cooking meals alongside their appreciation for the outdoors. As part of the trip the students had to be completely self-sufficient: so, they had to carry everything they needed on their backs, including camping and cooking equipment, first aid kits and lots of snacks!

The expedition began as soon as the students got off the bus at FRIM, Kepong with a walking route through the forest. The energy was maintained when getting into camp whilst setting up their tents, cooking, building campfires and even a night walk to see some pretty amazing bioluminescent animals. The following day started with packing away camp, cooking breakfast and a hike up a steep hill and through different forest trails. All groups were then debriefed and sent home for a much-needed shower and rest! The students displayed resilience, courage and excellent communication within their groups - well done.

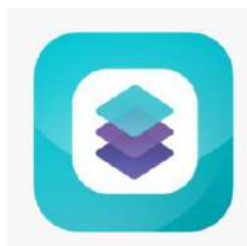
