Shakespeare comes to SJIIM

As an English teacher of many years, I am a huge believer in the importance of studying drama in schools, whether that be approaching it as a literary text in English lessons or practically in drama lessons. I was delighted then, this week, when the KL Players visited our school to perform for both students in our Elementary School and High School.

This is not the first time that the KL Players have performed Shakespeare. Before the pandemic we were treated to a performance of 'The Tempest' and their performance of 'Macbeth' was equally impressive.

Whilst some people may question the relevance of Shakespeare in the modern age, particularly when we are so far away geographically from Shakespeare's birthplace, there is still a great deal we can learn from arguably the greatest playwright of all time.

Shakespeare's plays deal with universal themes that are still relevant today, such as love, jealousy, power, betrayal, and ambition. These themes have been explored in many cultures, making them relatable to people of all backgrounds.


Shakespeare's plays have been adapted and reimagined in various ways that appeal to modern audiences in Asia. For example, his plays have been turned into films, TV series, musicals, and even manga and anime. These adaptations often incorporate Asian cultural elements and interpretations, making them relevant and relatable to local audiences. I once went to see 'Macbeth' that was performed entirely in Thai with the performers wearing Thai traditional costumes.

I was also fortunate enough to see the Royal Shakespeare Company perform Henry IV Part I, Henry IV Part II and Henry V on three successive nights in Beijing in 2016 with the dialogue displayed on large screens in Mandarin showing that the appetite for Shakespeare's works is still strong all over the world.

In a few weeks, we will have our performance of Beauty and the Beast from the Elementary School and, in the coming year, I am looking forward to even more opportunities for students to experience Performing Arts. In September, SJIIM will host the FOBISIA Stage and Makeup Challenge. It is important then for our students to experience performances such as those they saw on Friday and my thanks to Mr Dorrell and Ms O'Neil for organising this as part of our World Book Week Celebrations.


