PE Updates regarding masks and jewellery

Firstly, thank you to all who attended and raised questions during the Parent Rep meeting. Our focus, as a team, has always been on keeping children safe and mitigating risk, where possible, so as to ensure that students can safely engage in sport. In light of this feedback, please see below some changes we will be implementing after the half-term break for both the Elementary School and High School.

Masks

Following the pandemic and disruption to learning that entailed, we are thankfully back to normal PE lessons and have been for some time. As such, masks will no longer be worn during practical lessons and students will be required to remove them. This decision is based on advice from health professionals so as to reduce the likelihood of further health risks (hyperventilation) and promote personal hygiene. Please also be reminded that if the haze levels rise above 101 all outdoor activities will cease in line with school policy.

Earrings/studs

All learners are required to remove all earrings/studs prior to participating in any practical activity. On the occasions when earrings/studs cannot be removed, students will be required to cover up their earring/stud with masking tape. This will need to be provided by the student. This is upon recommendation from 'First Aid for Sport' and in the guidelines from 'The PE Schools Network' to keep all learners safe and reduce risk of injury.

I would like to thank you all for your support and understanding in these matters as we attempt to keep our learners healthy and safe whilst in our care.




Student-led assemblies
