# From front of the class to front of the pack: the inspiring double life of our ironman teacher!

On Sunday 19th May, our very own High School Humanities teacher, Mr Joe Taylor, qualified for the World Championship Ironman competition in Taupo, New Zealand this December.

In order to qualify, Mr Taylor, dominated a gruelling sequence of events. Mr Taylor began the event by swimming 1.9km off the southern coast of Desaru, followed by a 90km bike ride and finished strong by running a half marathon of 21km. He finished in a staggering 5 hours and 18 minutes, resulting in his automatic qualification to the world championships.

As if that wasn't impressive enough, Mr Taylor achieved the collective fastest time as part of a 5 man team, enabling the team to win the Asia Club Championship.

We have asked Mr Taylor to share some of his experiences and reflections with us.

This event gave me butterflies in my stomach, I had been preparing for a number of years. My training in 2024 had been going very well and I had been able to achieve real consistency leading up the the race. However, I still had a mix of emotions before I started, including nerves and excitement as I stood on the beach and contemplated the challenge ahead and the plan in my mind to execute during the race. This was going to require resilience.

I really do not like swimming and I always see it as just something I need to show determination with and have to overcome to enable me to enjoy the rest of the race. The swim actually went okay (plenty of room to improve though). Cheered on by friends, I got to my bike and my race really started!

I really believe that the character and virtues that I use in order to help me train and then cross my sporting finish line are firmly comparable and relatable to pupils of St Joseph's as they navigate through school life, education and exams.

Those butterflies in my stomach grew, they turned into dragons and they breathed fire. Thank you all for your support - diolch yn fawr.


Congratulations to all our participating students for their hard work and dedication, and for representing our school with such distinction at the KLJMC!
