## SJIS ES Science Week

Science Week was a fantastic celebration of curiosity and discovery, with students demonstrating cooperation, perseverance, and excellence in every activity. From Early Years to Key Stage 2, everyone embraced hands-on learning and scientific exploration.

Students across the school explored exciting experiments, from creating oobleck and lava lamps to investigating density, chemical reactions, and materials in real-world contexts. Each year group engaged in activities that sparked curiosity and encouraged scientific thinking. Year 4, 5, and 6 also had the opportunity to visit the high school science showcase, where they explored advanced experiments and interactive demonstrations.

Across Key Stage 2, students worked together on catapult building, the spaghetti challenge, and egg drop investigations. Their teamwork and problem-solving skills shone as they tackled scientific challenges with enthusiasm. Science Week was an inspiring experience for all, igniting a passion for discovery that will continue throughout the year.

### SJIS Book Week




