As they connect with the migrant community in Malaysia, Year 6 is collecting preloved textiles to help empower Afghan refugee women in the NGO Greater Action. These refugee tailors repurpose donated textiles into unique handcrafted items that they can sell to support their families. Acceptable textiles include kain songket, sarong, sarongs, bedsheets, quilt covers, curtains, scarves, cushion covers, tablecloths, and sofa throws. Donations of clean, good-condition items can be made to the textiles dropbin in the school foyer from 30 May - 6 June 2025.

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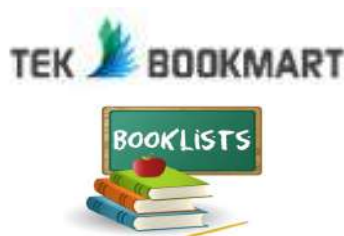
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
