The Lasallian Leadership Camp 2025

FOBISIA CODE BREAKING MATHS CHALLENGE



FOBISIA Code Breaking Maths Challenge 2025

Throughout last week, our students took part in the annual FOBISIA Codebreaking Competition 2025 hosted at schoolcodebreaking.com, joining more than 36,000 students from 110 schools across the region. The challenge was a superb platform for problem-solving, persistence and teamwork, and the energy in lessons was palpable as pupils tackled increasingly tricky ciphers together.

We are delighted to share that our school ranked among the top 20 schools in Levels 1A, 1B and 3. Participation in these three levels accounted for 566 of our 677 entries, approximately 84% of our total, reflecting strong engagement across the early stages and advanced problem sets. The competition was open to years 4 to 13, and 84% of students in these year groups took part over the week with real enthusiasm and diligence.

Entries by level: 1A (327), 1B (183), 2A (89), 2B (17), 3 (56), 4 (5).

We are proud of all participants for representing the school so positively!
