Celebrating a decade at St. Joseph's Institution International School (SJIS) feels like watching a small seed grow into a magnificent tree. As a **pioneer staff** member, my journey began in 2016, long before the vibrant campus we see today was even built. I still vividly recall the mix of anxiety and excitement during my initial interview, which was held in a simple unit at the **Casa Tropicana condo**.

With the campus still under construction, our small team operated in a state of constant transition. We spent those early days working out of a temporary apartment before moving into "**The Catalogue House**", a showroom unit. I remember the shared determination we felt while planning the future of the school from a living room. We weren't just colleagues; we were founders building a Lasallian community from the ground up.

Starting my tenure as the **High School Secretary**, I have had the privilege of serving under **five different High School Principals**. Each leader brought a unique vision, and navigating those transitions allowed me to grow into my additional role as **Exams Officer**. As we celebrate "10 years of teaching minds and touching hearts," I am incredibly proud to have been here since day one.

The last ten years have been a beautiful collection of "firsts." I fondly remember our **first Yee Sang and Lion Dance** in celebration of the Lunar New Year, **first Hari Raya** celebration and **first Deepavali** which brought our diverse staff together in a burst of culture and joy. We shared the excitement of our **first International Day**, celebrating our global identity, and the camaraderie of our **first staff party**. Perhaps most movingly, I remember the pride of our **first graduation ceremony**, seeing our inaugural cohort prepare to "Leave to Serve."


## Catholic and Christian Life


## *Matilda the Musical Jr.*




## This Week's Assemblies


### Save the Date:

### Y7/8 Parent Workshop: Pathways to 2036

Year 7 and 8 parents attended a pathways workshop led by Ms Ellis (HS Assistant Principal), Ms Warrier (Head of Sixth Form), and Ms Quennie (University & Careers Counsellor). The session, *Pathways to 2036*, focused on future readiness beyond subject selection. We discussed the changing world of work, the impact of AI, and the importance of transferable and character skills (critical thinking, creativity, communication, adaptability, resilience, integrity, courage).

A key takeaway was that IGCSE/A Level choices should build cognitive flexibility, not limit career paths. We shared practical next steps for Year 9 and beyond, as well as resources to support early conversations at home.
