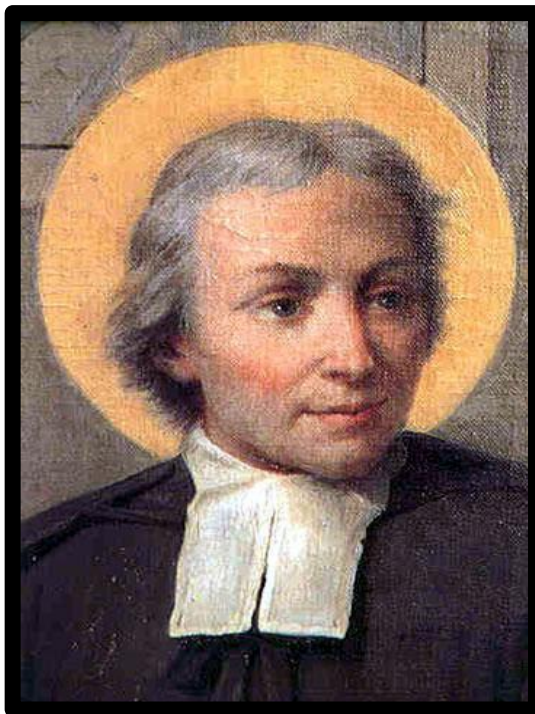

Tickets for our Elementary production of *Moana Jr.* are now on sale!



### Morning Drop off - Student Safety

Recently, we have noticed an increasing number of Elementary students arriving at school alone before 7:30am. Please note that staff supervision begins at 7:30am only, with Years 4–6 supervised on the field and Years 1–3 supervised on the blue playground. Students arriving before this time are unsupervised. To help us maintain a safe environment for all children, we kindly ask that students are dropped off from 7:30am onwards or, if arriving earlier, remain with a parent or guardian until supervision begins. We greatly appreciate your support and cooperation in helping us keep all children safe at school.



## Notice to Parents and Students – Lunch Collection Conduct

Over the past few weeks, there have been ongoing concerns regarding student conduct during lunch collection in the foyer, particularly involving deliveries from U8GW10.com. Issues include excessive plastic waste, students leaving food and rubbish behind, overcrowding and rushing during collection times, and reports of food items being taken from another student's order. This behaviour is unacceptable, creates inconvenience for others, and does not reflect our Lasallian values of respect and responsibility. Students are reminded to collect only their own food, dispose of rubbish appropriately, and keep the foyer clean and orderly. We will be addressing these concerns with students next week should the situation continue. We also ask parents using this provider to request that food be packed individually and clearly labelled with students' names to support a smoother collection process.

Parenting teenagers in today's world can feel both exciting and overwhelming. Between the rapid rise of AI, increasing academic pressures, social media, emotional wellbeing, and future career uncertainty, many parents are asking the same question: *How can I best support my child without taking over the journey for them?*

Our **Shift and Soar in SJIIS** Parent Information Series has been designed to help families navigate these challenges with greater confidence, understanding, and connection.

In our second session, *Unplugged and Unbothered*, parents will learn more about stress, emotional regulation, and the impact of digital overload on teenagers. This practical workshop focuses on supporting young people to manage emotions, build resilience, and develop healthier responses to pressure and burnout.

The third session, *Career Quest: Parent Edition*, encourages parents to move beyond managing every step of their child's journey and instead become thoughtful observers and encouragers of potential. The session will focus on listening, noticing strengths, and helping students discover pathways that are meaningful to them.

We warmly invite all parents to join us for these informative and supportive conversations as we work together to help our students shift with confidence and soar with purpose.

Adolescence is a crucial stage in a young person's development. During the high school years, students are not only growing academically, but also developing the character, habits, and behaviours that will shape their future relationships, choices, and resilience. When parents and schools work together, students are far more likely to feel supported, secure, and motivated to make positive decisions.

Our **Building Character and Positive Behaviour in High School** parent workshop has been designed to strengthen the partnership between home and school while offering practical insight into how positive behaviour is nurtured and supported in the secondary years. Parents will gain a clearer understanding of the connection between character and behaviour, as well as how behaviour is managed in high school through guidance, accountability, and restorative approaches that encourage growth and responsibility.

The workshop will also provide practical strategies for supporting positive behaviour at home, including communication approaches, routines, and setting clear expectations. Importantly, the session will explore how consistent messages between home and school can help students flourish both personally and academically.
