This Week's Highlight at SJIS Ten Year Celebration Walk

As part of our ongoing 10-Year Anniversary celebrations, SJIS came together this week for a special Ten Year Celebration Walk, marking a decade of faith, community and service. Students from across the school joined together throughout the morning in a symbolic shared challenge to complete 10 laps as a whole-school community, representing our 10 years of growth and achievement. The event reflected the spirit that has shaped our school since its founding - students supporting one another, celebrating together and living out our motto, *Enter to Learn, Leave to Serve*. It was wonderful to see students of all ages participating with enthusiasm and encouragement, creating a strong sense of unity across the campus. Moments such as these remind us how much our school community has grown over the past decade and how grateful we are to celebrate this important milestone together.



Neurodiversity Week

This week, our school community celebrated Neurodiversity Week, focusing on the theme "Different Senses, Different Experiences". Neurodiversity teaches us that neurological differences are natural human variations. Following on from last year where we explored how our brains are wired in different ways, we learned about how we all sense the world differently, our diverse ways of thinking and sensing and all the advantages this can have for individuals and our community. This week is an opportunity to develop our self-awareness about our sensory experiences, to practice the virtues of consideration, respect and compassion so we can support our classmates who may sense their surroundings differently than we do.

The students explored their individual sensory profiles to understand if they are hypersensitive (sensing intensely) or hyposensitive (having lower sensitivity) to different stimuli. We also learned about our hidden senses like the proprioceptive system, our internal body map, and the vestibular system, which acts as our balance centre. To explore these concepts further, students visited our Sensory Space in the Drama Room and our pop up exercise zone.

We ended the week with our special dress code celebration: wear your school uniform on the top half to show we are one community, but choose your own clothing for the bottom half to express your individuality and personality. This understanding brought our school community closer together in celebrating that we are all different and we all belong.



Sound Waves

What an incredible morning at our ES Sound Waves Music Showcase! Our students lit up the stage with a wonderful variety of performances, from singing and choir pieces to impressive instrumental showcases. The event also highlighted exciting opportunities such as the AIMS Primary Orchestra Festival and Big Sing, as we continue to encourage and grow student participation in these amazing musical experiences. We are incredibly proud of all our performers for the hard work, dedication, professionalism, and commitment they demonstrated throughout their rehearsals and performances today. As it was their first time participating in this competition, the students showed great courage and enthusiasm stepping onto the court. In addition to their performance, the students were also learning throughout the competition. It has been a very popular installation for students seeking somewhere to relax and recharge at break and lunch times and those who enjoy more active play. The week ended with our dress up day to celebrate not only our differences, but what brings us together.



Year 9 Sip & Paint

This week, our Year 9 students took part in our annual Sip & Paint event, welcoming parents into the Art department during lesson time for a shared creative experience.

Working step-by-step, students and their parents painted a series of 'trendy toast' artworks, exploring colour blending, composition and brush control. They also experimented with relief techniques, using gesso and impasto to build texture and add depth to their pieces.

The sessions offered parents a valuable insight into the level of focus, patience and resilience required to produce a successful art outcome, something our students demonstrate in lessons each week.

The event produced some fantastic outcomes, but more importantly, it fostered meaningful interactions between students and parents, strengthening our school community. It was particularly rewarding to see students guiding and encouraging their parents through the process, developing both confidence and communication skills along the way.

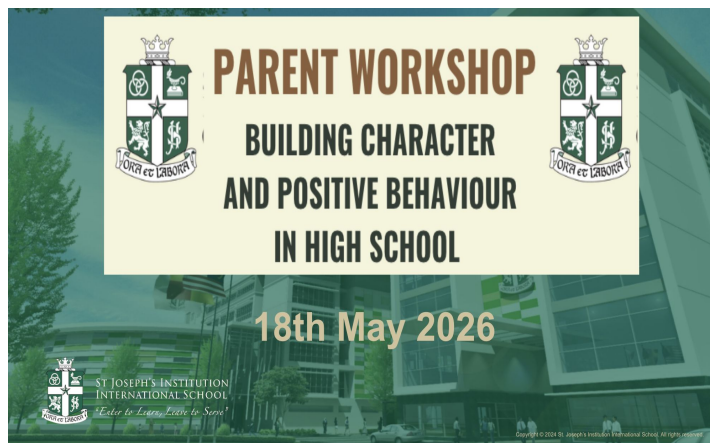
