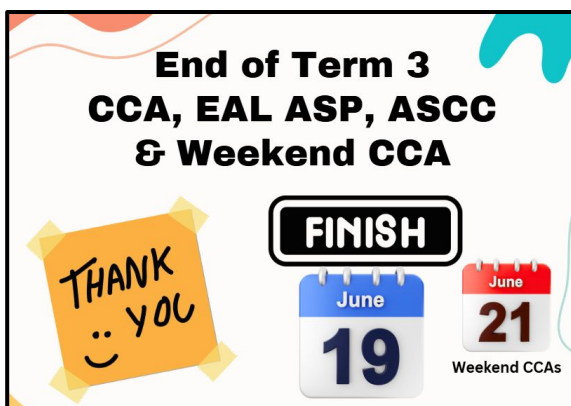

Y10 Roadmap to A-Levels

For the last 5 weeks, Year 10 students have been receiving extensive support to make strategic choices for their A-Levels.

This first included multiple form time support sessions with Ms Warriar, Head of Sixth Form and Ms Quennie, University and Careers Counsellor and some 1-2-1 guidance meetings. We were also pleased to welcome Ms Emma Davidson from MABECS to speak about making the best A-Level choices.

Students also got the opportunity to hear directly from SJIIS alumni to find out about their decision making process and top tips for revision and success.

Sixth Form Taster Day

All Year 10 students got the chance to 'taste' their potential A-Level subjects, taking a lesson as a sixth former. Classrooms across the school were buzzing with curiosity, discussion and enthusiasm as students explored new disciplines, challenged themselves with more advanced content and began reflecting on their future pathways.

The feedback from students was overwhelmingly positive. Some of the comments included:

Biology: "I engaged in a debate which was very insightful and interesting as I knew nothing about the topic and had to rely on the case study I was given."

Design Technology: "I enjoyed the creativity in designing the chair."

Drama: "It really opened my eyes to the different forms of expression that can be taken in art."

Economics: "This subject was interesting, I like how it relates to and discusses real life problems and theories, I'm really interested in taking it."

English Literature: "I really loved discussing the lens that you put on to see individual themes and details from the book you read. It opened my eyes to different opinions, injustice and the way the author conveyed it and their reasonings for it for the better of the world."

History: "It made me reflect a lot on how easily you accept information and to what extent you can accept something for being true."

Students also left with a clear summer exploration pathway task which is available on their Form Time Google Classroom, if parents would also like take part in this journey.

This document is about curiosity, exploration and discovering more about yourself.</p> <p>Use this booklet to plan some purposeful activities over the summer that will help you better understand your strengths, interests and future aspirations. Whether that means reading a book, speaking to someone in a career you admire, completing an online course or attending an event, every experience can teach you something valuable.</p> <p>When you return in August, we will reflect on what you learned—not just about different subjects or careers, but about yourself.</p> <p>I have included an example so that you know what to aim for. Many fears about AI may come from science fiction rather than evidence. AI is not inherently good or bad—it depends on how humans design and use it. Ethical questions may be more important than technological questions. Algorithms can be programmed with values, but deciding which values to use is difficult. I had not considered that AI systems already make decisions in our daily lives. Autonomous vehicles raise difficult ethical dilemmas with no obvious answers. AI may create benefits for society, such as safer transport and better healthcare. The greatest risks from AI may come from humans using it maliciously rather than AI itself becoming evil. Open-source technology can sometimes be safer because more people can inspect it. Intelligence is not simply about speed; human intelligence is more complex than processing power. Debates about AI reveal deeper questions about what it means to be human.

Duke of Edinburgh - Silver Expedition

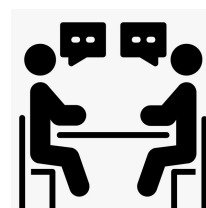

Discovery Showcase celebrates curiosity beyond the curriculum

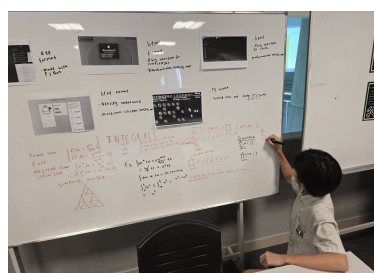
This week, we were delighted to host our inaugural **Discovery Showcase**, celebrating the achievements of students participating in the SJIS Discovery Programme.

Launched this year as a pilot initiative, the Discovery Programme provides stretch and challenge opportunities for students identified as having exceptional academic potential. Rather than focusing on acceleration or additional workload, the programme encourages students to pursue areas of genuine intellectual curiosity, explore learning beyond the curriculum and develop independence as learners.

Throughout the year, students have undertaken self-directed projects across a diverse range of disciplines. From investigating the photochemistry of circadian rhythms and researching tropical moth species, to coding, creative writing, dress design, engineering and mathematical exploration, students have demonstrated impressive curiosity, creativity and commitment.

The showcase provided an opportunity for students to share their work with parents, staff and peers, explaining not only what they created, but also the questions they explored, the challenges they encountered and the discoveries they made along the way.

At SJIS, we believe that education is about more than acquiring knowledge; it is about nurturing a lifelong love of learning. In a world where AI provides answers in seconds, curiosity remains one of the most valuable qualities a young person can possess. The Discovery Showcase was a wonderful celebration of that curiosity, and we are incredibly proud of all the students who participated in this year's programme.

High School TeachMeet
