What Does a “Balanced School Meal” Actually Look Like ?

We often hear the term “balanced meal”, but what does it really mean for a growing child?

A balanced meal is one that provides the **right combination** of nutrients to support your child’s energy, concentration, and development throughout the school day. In simple terms, it includes three key components:



1. Carbohydrates for energy. Rice, pasta, bread, potatoes, or noodles provide the fuel children need to stay active and focused in class.

2. Protein for growth and fullness. Chicken, fish, eggs, tofu, legumes, and dairy products help support healthy growth and keep children satisfied for longer.

3. Vegetables and Fruit for vitamins and fibre. Vegetables and fruits provide essential nutrients, fibre, and antioxidants that support immunity, digestion, and overall health.

A balanced meal is not about perfection at every bite, but about consistency over time. When children regularly eat meals that include all three components, they are more likely to experience steady energy levels and better focus in school. Fruit also plays an important supporting role—providing natural sweetness along with important vitamins and antioxidants.

In a school setting, balanced meals are especially important because morning snack time and lunch fuels their day. Meals that are not balanced, overly processed, or lacking in key nutrients can leave children feeling tired or distracted. FOBISIA Senior Drama Festival 2026

The Drama department are delighted to invite students aged 14+ (in October) to apply for this year's **FOBISIA Senior Drama Festival**, which will be hosted by **North London Collegiate School Singapore** from **26th–30th October 2026**.

This exciting festival brings together students from international schools across Asia to collaborate, create, and perform alongside professional theatre practitioners and other young performers who share a passion for drama and theatre-making. This year's workshops and festival activities will be led by the renowned British theatre company **The Handlebards**, who are well known for their energetic, inventive, and highly physical approach to theatre-making and performance.



Over the course of the festival, students will take part in a range of practical workshops, ensemble activities, rehearsals, and performances. Working in mixed-school groups, students will explore creative theatre-making techniques and devise original performance material inspired by the festival theme (The Past vs the Future: Memories vs Innovation).

Attendance is **strongly recommended for all iGCSE Drama students**, as the festival provides an invaluable opportunity to develop practical performance and devising skills that **directly support their coursework**. Students will also have the chance to explore and discuss many of the theatrical methods and approaches studied as part of the **Year 11 written examination**. The collaborative and workshop-based nature of the festival makes it an excellent way for students to deepen their understanding of contemporary theatre practice in a practical setting.

For **students who are not studying GCSE Drama**, this is still a fantastic opportunity to develop highly transferable skills such as:

- Public speaking and communication
- Creativity and problem-solving
- Leadership and collaboration
- Confidence working in teams and presenting ideas
- Project development and creative thinking

These are all **valuable skills for further and higher education and can help students stand out in university, scholarship, and future application processes**.

The estimated cost of the trip is **around RM3800**, depending on flight and exchange rate fluctuations.
